2010 Junior Staff Positions

Qualifications to serve at CBC:

- Christian whose personal life demonstrates that you are walking with the Lord Jesus Christ.
- Desire to communicate your personal faith to youth and adults.
- Have an emotional and spiritual maturity which is readily seen.
- Have a love for children and young people.
- Able to work together as a team.
- Exhibit a desire to learn.
- Demonstrate Christian character.
- Desire to serve others.
- Agree with the Statement of Faith of the Evangelical Free Church of America.

The following positions are open to juniors and seniors in high school, who have completed at least 1 year of the YMC program. These positions are paid \$50 per week and have a limited number of openings. The junior staff commitment is a minimum of 7 weeks: 1 week of staff training and 6 weeks of service. They will serve in a specific position but must be flexible to fill in other positions when needed.

Junior Counselors - Assist a senior counselor with day and night responsibilities for a group of campers assigned to the cabin. Help plan and lead Bible studies, assist at skills class and adventure program, and help lead one-on-one discipleship time with each camper. Are responsible for the campers in the cabin under the senior counselor's direction.

Junior Kitchen Assistants - Work with the head and assistant cook to prepare the dining hall for meals, serving of the meals, and clean up after each meal including putting food away, doing dishes, and removing trash.

Junior Maintenance Staff - Help maintain the buildings, grounds, machinery, etc. Work to maintain overall appearance and cleanliness of the camp. Assist housekeeping as needed.

Junior Housekeeping Staff - Perform daily cleaning and other cleaning projects, stock supplies, do laundry, check all areas periodically during the day, and oversee other staff members who are assigned to help.

Junior Adventure Program Assistants - Assist the adventure program coordinator in accomplishing their responsibilities.

Junior Office Assistant - Work with the summer office manager and help with any paperwork, filing, typing, and registration process. Help process mail and distribute to campers.

Junior Store and Canteen Assistant - Work with the summer store manager and help with the daily functions of the camp store and canteen. Help stock shelves as needed.
