

The Roving Volunteers in Christ's Service (RVIC'S) arrived on Apr 29th and all the projects planned for them and a few more were completed before they left on May 26. They helped remodel the canteen, installed plumbing in the bath house, and build the bunks in the boy's cabins. We also had a lot of volunteers show up for our spring work weekend. Of the 28 things on the to do list, we only had about 6 things left to finish. Last year we started the reworking of the RV hook-ups by running in the

water lines. This year we finished putting in the electrical and tidying up the parking posts. With all the rain we have been getting, mowing is a steady task around here. It seems like it is sunny every day and rains every night. We were able to purchase eight new canoes and moved the Red Sea Landing over by the docks. Recently, we have redone the canoe rack and painted/hung up new racks for the life jackets and paddles inside the Red Sea Landing. We will soon be finishing the steel roof on the building. The two-way radios we have are outdated, so we have been purchasing new ones to facilitate

all our staff. The fire extinguishers we currently have are checked up, inspected, and ready for use in case of any emergencies. Our latest inspection for them was in 2018, and therefore, all fire extinguishers have been replaced and the Ansl system in the kitchen is up to code. New LED lights are being installed in the Rock and Tabernacle and will be arriving this month. The red cable claps on the bridge that needed to be changed have been completed. It has been an exciting summer season and am so happy to be here.

Danae Dobson is an accomplished author who also maintains an active speaking ministry, addressing women at church-related events, such as banquets, teas, and conferences. Danae was born in So. California and wrote her first children's book "Woof! A Bedtime Story About A Dog" at the age of 12, becoming the youngest author in the 25-year history of Word, Inc. A distinction that she still holds

today. She has appeared on several TV shows, and has been a guest on more than one hundred radio broadcasts, including Minirth Meier and Focus on the Family. Danae is the daughter of Dr. James and Shirley Dobson of the Family Talk broadcast, and has a younger brother, Ryan, who is also an author and speaker, and host of a podcast. Danae continues to reside in So. California.
