Minimum Qualifications:

- Have a relationship with Jesus Christ and a passion for sharing the gospel of Christ.
- Must be at least 18 years old or be at least one year out of High school.
- Must have a reliable form of transportation.
- Have basic knowledge of housekeeping and maintenance operations.
- Able to work and be active outdoors in the heat for long periods of time.
- Must have a minimum of one year of experience being a camp counselor.

General Responsibility:

To support Cooperstown Bible Camp's mission and purpose of Making Jesus Known. The Advocacy Counselor serves as a counselor to our counselors. They will come along our counselors and assist them when needed under direction of the Program Director. Along with being a counselor to our counselors, they will also serve as a para-counselor for campers who need more one on one supervision or instruction. Their focus is to work alongside the Program Director to ensure our counselors have the support they need. Along with these things the Advocacy Counselor will also serve as support staff when needed to ensure that Camps needs are able to be met throughout the summer camping season.

Specific Responsibilities:

1. To work alongside all other staff living in Christian Community to create lasting relationships.
2. Have high energy, kindness, and patience always with campers.
3. Follow all CBC standards and agree with the EFCA statement of faith.
4. Represent the camp and its purpose in a positive manner when you are in public.
5. Possess an attitude and actions which continually reflect that Christ lives in you.
6. Serve as a Counselor to our Counselors to ensure they have the support they need to thrive.
7. Disciplining behaviors when safety is compromised.
8. Responsible for helping in setting up and taking down of all camp activities when needed.
9. Serve as a Para-Counselor for our campers that need one on one supervision.
10. Follow all standards set forth by the Camp Directors.
11. Ability to work in all other areas of camp if needed. (TTO)

- Create a welcoming and open environment for all campers, guests, and other staff members.
