

Executive Director Report
NPD Conference 2026

God blessed the ministry of Cooperstown Bible Camp throughout 2025. As I reflect on the many campers, retreat guests, staff, and volunteers who came through campus this past year, I am filled with gratitude for the Lord's faithfulness. We witnessed His hand at work as He encouraged hearts, provided for needs, brought comfort in uncertainty, and reminded us again and again that this ministry is ultimately His. When we step aside and allow the Lord to lead, amazing things happen. Even more humbling is when He graciously invites us to take part in what He is already doing.

The 2025 season was not without its challenges. During the first week of summer camp, an unexpected inland "hurricane" struck our area, knocking out power and causing damage to buildings and trees. By God's grace, everyone remained safe. Later in August, another severe storm resulted in additional power outages and fallen trees. It seemed that nearly every week of camp brought the threat of storms. *But God.* In the midst of these challenges, the Lord continued to work powerfully.

This summer, 347 campers attended our summer camp programs. We rejoiced in witnessing four salvations, one baptism, and several campers expressing interest in future service at camp. We were especially encouraged that 113 of our campers were first-time attendees, an exciting reminder that God continues to bring new families to Cooperstown Bible Camp.

Our retreat season was also full and fruitful. Year-round programming included both CBC-hosted events and guest groups. We facilitated 10 CBC-programmed events, including Man Camp, Women's Retreat, and Autumnmatics, and welcomed 20 guest groups representing ministries such as Child Evangelism Fellowship (CEF), Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA), and churches from across the Northern Plains District. The calendar was full, and through it all, ministry was accomplished for the glory of God.

A significant highlight of the 2025 season was the celebration of Cooperstown Bible Camp's 100th Anniversary during Labor Day Family Camp. We had 218 registered participants for the full weekend and welcomed more than 400 people for our Sunday morning worship service. Families enjoyed teaching sessions in the front field tent, wagon rides, fellowship, live music by the Stokka Band, adventure programming, and wonderful meals, all while celebrating a century of God's faithfulness to this ministry. We were blessed to be encouraged through the faithful preaching of God's Word by our speakers Brian Wright, Kevin Konpelien, and Mike Adamek. I am deeply thankful for all who volunteered, attended, and joined us in fellowship during this historic celebration.

On a personal note, I want to sincerely thank the Northern Plains District and the CBC Board for allowing my family and me to serve at Cooperstown Bible Camp over the past seven years. Since moving here in 2019, we have seen the Lord do remarkable work in the lives of campers, staff, and guests. It has been a privilege to serve the Lord by serving you. Please continue to pray for our family, our staff, and the future of Cooperstown Bible Camp as we seek the Lord's will and direction for His camp.
